

Dr. Tommy Nai-Jen Chang is a board-certified plastic surgeon in Taiwan and currently serves as **Professor** in the Division of Reconstructive Microsurgery, Department of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, Chang Gung Memorial Hospital, Linkou Medical Center, Taiwan. Since 2012, he has received specialized training in peripheral nerve reconstruction under the mentorship of Professor David Chwei-Chin Chuang. From 2015 to 2016, he completed a Peripheral Nerve Research Fellowship at the Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids), University of Toronto, Canada, under the supervision of Dr. Gregory Borschel, Dr. Tessa Gordon, and Dr. Ronald Zuker. His clinical and research interests focus on peripheral nerve reconstruction, including motor, sensory, and autonomic (sympathetic) nerve reconstruction, with particular expertise in robot-assisted sympathetic nerve reconstruction at Chang Gung Memorial Hospital.

In 2016, Dr. Chang founded the **International Microsurgery Club (IMC)** on Facebook, which has since grown into the world's largest online microsurgery community, with more than **22,900 members** worldwide as of July 2026. In 2017, he was invited to serve as the **Editor-in-Chief** of the *International Microsurgery Journal (IMJ)*. In 2018, he established the **International Microsurgery Website (IMW)**, an educational platform that now hosts nearly **800** recorded webinars and surgical videos. During the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, Dr. Chang launched the **IMC Webinar Series** to provide uninterrupted microsurgical education for surgeons around the world. By July 2026, the series had delivered more than **630** educational events. In 2025, the IMC was officially registered as an academic society in Taiwan, and Dr. Chang became its founding President. Through the integration of social media, digital education, and international collaboration, the IMC continues to advance microsurgical education and promote global knowledge exchange among reconstructive surgeons.
